Mountbatten took up the post of Commander-in-Chief Mediterranean (CINCMED) in May 1952, in charge of the British fleet in the Mediterranean and based at Malta. His second-in-command, William Davis, was to act as sea commander, while Mountbatten concentrated on the political and strategic aspects of the command. Mountbatten was concerned to improve efficiency and morale in the fleet and he made regular visits to all his squadrons and to countries in the region, including Yugoslavia, Greece, Egypt and Ethiopia. When Mountbatten took command of the British fleet in the Mediterranean, the US fleet there was headed by Admiral Robert Carney, CINC SOUTH, based at Naples. It was the view of NATO that there should be a single commander-in-chief in overall charge of naval forces in the Mediterranean and there was some discussion between Britain and the USA over which country should succeed to the command. At the end of 1952, Mountbatten was created Commander-in-Chief Allied Forces Mediterranean (CINCAFMED) in addition to his existing post of CINCMED. He was promoted to admiral in February 1953. French, Italian, Greek and Turkish admirals, each with their national navies, together with an American fleet, now formed an international force, co-ordinated by CINCAFMED. Mountbatten's second-in-command took over matters of purely British interest, but friction still existed between the bases at Malta and Naples until Admiral Carney was replaced by Admiral William Fechteler in 1953.

While the files cover many naval and routine matters, the series also includes private correspondence from this period. Subjects include the visit by Queen Elizabeth II and the Duke of Edinburgh to Malta at the end of their Commonwealth Tour in 1954 and, among the `papers of special interest', are materials relating to the coronation, the funeral of Queen Mary, the creation of the post of CINCAFMED, press cuttings and magazine articles featuring Mountbatten, a copy of the turnover notes for Mountbatten's successor as Fourth Sea Lord, papers concerning fleet exercises and reviews, and correspondence advising Mountbatten to avoid engaging in political discussions with the national leaders he met on his travels. Most of the papers are letters, signals and telegrams, to and from Mountbatten or his secretaries. The papers are now in an alphabetical sequence of files, with the contents of each arranged on a chronological basis.
