Pathway process

The steps in the Successful Futures Pathway are designed to bring together different aspects of career thinking in a way that is relevant to you, as an individual.

You should complete the Pathway at least once a year. The earlier you start, the more time you will have to explore ideas and develop skills you want for your future. It should take about an hour to complete, but you may wish to spend more time exploring the resources available.

Your Personal Academic Tutor is also likely to talk to you about what you have gained from completing the Pathway.

Step 1

Define your version of success. Take a moment to reflect on career ideas and aspirations you may already have.

Step 2

Discover your skills for success. Explore the Southampton Skills Model, complete the skills self-assessment, and identify the skills that have been mapped to your course.

Step 3

Connect your skills and career ideas. Use our AI Chat Bot to generate career ideas, and review how your skills and experience align with your career aspirations.

Step 4

Build your path to success. Find opportunities to develop skills and experience, learn how to showcase your skills, and create a clear, actionable plan.

SUCCESSFUL FUTURES PATHWAY

Finding the time and space (and motivation!) to reflect on your skills and think about your career ambitions is easier said than done.


We have therefore developed an online tool for you to work through at your own pace, focussing on what's most useful to you. Available on MyCareer, the Successful Futures Pathway shows that career planning can be flexible, whatever stage you are at. It is OK to change your mind!

The pathway aligns with the Southampton Skills Model, which outlines 14 skills identified by our employers, industry partners, and broader research insights as being sought after and valued by graduate recruiters.

We've mapped your course to the Southampton Skills Model, to help you identify and showcase the skills you're developing during your studies. You can use the Successful Futures Pathway to check which skills have been mapped for your course and explore new ways to develop skills and gain experience.



TALK TO AN ADVISER

Our dedicated CV Support appointments offer a 15-minute individual advice session on creating a standout CV or tailoring your CV to a specific job sector or role.

Guidance Appointments

During a 45-minute appointment we can help you to consider your short and long-term career plans, focus your applications, prepare for interviews or perfect your job search strategies. We offer a programme of opportunities to help you gain the knowledge and resources necessary to have a positive impact in society.

Tackling the UN Sustainable Development Goals

At the Social Impact Lab, we define social impact as any commitment to tackling one or more of the 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals. Whether you are interested in a career working in the not-for-profit sector or have an idea for a community-based project, social enterprise, or campaign, our mission is to equip you with the knowledge, skills and experience to help you make a tangible difference to the issues that matter to you.

The Social Impact Lab is based at the Junction and runs parallel to our student enterprise activities. We provide funding and individual support to grow your ideas, practical experience through internships and volunteering, support for student societies, and a range of talks, workshops and networking opportunities to help support and develop your ideas.

CAREER MENTORING PROGRAMME

THE IMPORTANCE OF WORK EXPERIENCE

A key factor that will set you apart from other students during the recruitment process is your ability to demonstrate work experience. This will provide you with a portfolio of transferable skills and potentially inspire your future career direction. Employers are increasingly looking for students who are able to combine academic achievement with practical hands-on experience.

At the University of Southampton, we are committed to providing you with the skills and opportunities to ensure post-graduation employment success. We will give you the support you need to secure work experience, from providing advice on how to source a job to guidance on the application and selection process.

Benefits of work experience:

- → Develop a range of transferable skills, personal qualities and competencies
- → Become more confident in your abilities
- → Begin to relate your experiences and skills to the workplace
- → Make more informed choices about your career and future
- → Network and develop your list of contacts
- → Enhance your CV and improve your job prospects

STUDENT INNOVATION PROJECTS

A Student Innovation Project is designed to offer you the opportunity to gain invaluable experience of working on real-life business issues put forward by local businesses and not-for-profit organisations. You will work in a team of four to five students from across a range of faculties and year groups, to develop innovative solutions to a business problem.

Student Innovation Projects last for four weeks and are completed alongside your studies. The projects are open to students from any degree discipline and no business experience is required to take part.

How will a Student Innovation Project benefit you?

- → The training provided will help you to successfully complete the project
- → It will provide you with the opportunity to gain transferable skills in a short space of time
- → It will give you the opportunity to work in a team with peers from faculties that you may not normally engage with

INNOVATION CHALLENGE

The Innovation Challenge is an intensive, four-day project where you will work in a team of four to five students to solve a business challenge provided by top employers. Working together you will develop your research, communication and presentation skills, providing creative solutions to a business problem.

The Innovation Challenge is open to students studying any degree, at any stage of study and for up to 12 months after graduation. It takes place during the Easter and Summer vacations, giving you a chance of winning a great prize!

How will the Innovation Challenge benefit you?

- → A chance to build a portfolio of skills over a short space of time
- → The opportunity to work closely with top graduate employers on a real business issue
- → The most successful team will have the chance to win a fantastic prize at the end of the challenge



YEAR IN EMPLOYMENT PLACEMENTS

Year in Employment Placements offer many undergraduate students the opportunity to complete a placement year as part of their degree. The placement can be aligned to your course subject or in a completely unrelated area of interest. Through developing your professional and employability skills and gaining valuable experience, a Year in Employment Placement will help put you in a strong position for securing a graduate career.

The Work Experience Team are on hand to help you source opportunities and navigate the application process and will be your point of contact throughout your placement year. You could travel abroad or stay closer to home or university, depending on where your chosen role is based.

Students on most undergraduate courses without a placement opportunity can participate in a Year in Employment Placement. Our students have worked with a wide range of employers across all sectors for their placements including:

- → The Bank of England
- → Great Ormond Street Hospital
- → GSK
- → The Walt Disney Company
- → The MET Police

How could a Year in Employment Placement benefit you?

- → The opportunity to work in a chosen field of interest and find out if it's right for you
- → Most placements are paid with average salaries between £18.000 and £23.000
- → Successful students will have 'Year in Employment' added to their degree transcripts
- → On your Year in Employment you will gain transferable and/or technical skills, grow in confidence, and have the opportunity to build your professional network
- → The Year in Employment can potentially lead to being fast tracked through the application process for graduate roles or securing graduate employment during your placement


